It was fantastic to see the 'buzz' coming from the classrooms as children explained their own learning and demonstrated the methods they use in their everyday maths lessons. Lots of parents felt it was so useful to see the teaching and learning approaches used in school.

We have been busy reviewing our Christian Vision for our school alongside the values which provide us with a foundation on which to build. Staff and governors have been working alongside our Education Adviser from the Diocese to support these developments. Our children have begun to explore the key question: 'What are Christian Values and what do they look like in our school, homes and communities?' Children were tasked with discussing the values most important to them with their own families and feeding back to their classes and teachers. I look forward to sharing our revised vision for our School as we move into 2019!
