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At St Mary's, our core purpose is to provide an inclusive and nurturing environment that inspires a love of learning and prepares our children to be confident, resilient and compassionate citizens of the world. We believe that every child has the potential to achieve great things, and we strive to ignite that potential through a dynamic and engaging curriculum that meets the diverse needs and interests of our learners.

We are using many well-researched 'tools' to create and deliver our school's curriculum. In Reading, we use Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised and Fred's Teaching to develop fluent and confident readers who can explore the world through the power of books. In our Writing curriculum, we use key texts linked to our wider curriculum projects to foster a love of language and enable our children to express themselves with creativity, clarity and confidence. In Maths, we now use Power Maths to equip our children with the mathematical skills, understanding and confidence they need to succeed in a rapidly changing world. In our wider curriculum, we use the Cornerstones Curriculum to provide rich and meaningful learning experiences that enable our children to develop a deep understanding of the world around them and to make connections between different areas of knowledge. Over the coming weeks, all children will start to bring home regular 'Knowledge Organisers' which will detail a wide variety of knowledge which they will be learning through their current project/unit of work. These are solely aimed at keeping everybody informed of the learning taking place and you are free to use them as you wish!



Join us in a couple of weeks time as we promote the use of bikes and scooters throughout 'Cycle to School Week'. Whether you swap a car journey for bikes/scooters or head out for a bike ride as a family, every little helps!
