Note from Mr Homer

On Monday, we welcomed 'Kinetic Kate' from 'Fun Science' to deliver a fantastic assembly, inspiring our children with awe and wonder. Kate will be starting a science club, here at school, which will run on Tuesday afternoons from next week. Initially this will be for children in years two to four, but Kate will be offering an adapted club to our younger children, later in the year.









On Tuesday, a professional photographer spent the day with us, capturing some fantastic images of our school in action. These images will help to bring our learning environments to life whilst also giving our website and prospectus a burst of energy. On Tuesday and Thursday evening, lots of parents took up the offer of having an initial meeting with their child's new class teacher. These were great opportunities to ask questions about the year ahead and to share information about your children. To ensure that parents/carers are constantly kept up to date with their child's learning/ progress, this academic year we will be holding a parent consultation at the start of each term and sending home a progress report at the end of each term. These six official contact points will replace the one-off, longer report which parents normally receive at the end of the school year. We hope that, coupled with the sharing of regular Knowledge Organisers, this will enable us all to work closer together.

As you will know from recent news, schools are currently in the midst of a funding crisis which is putting a tight squeeze on all areas of school finances. Whilst we work hard to manage the funding of teaching and learning across our school to ensure that all children receive the education they so deserve, extra-curricular activities are becoming less and less manageable as the years go on.

For this reason, we have already been forced to review our Stay and Play Club policy and we are now having to review our use of educational visits/trips, also.

To enable us to continue to provide our children with the opportunity to attend school trips, we need access to additional funding. Every time we run a trip, there are a number of families who simply cannot afford to fund their child's place and therefore the school or School Association must cover the cost. In March 2024, our Year Four children will be off to Hooke Court and the total cost for this trip is over £7,000. It is inevitable that a portion of this cost will have to be covered by the school.

We are now actively seeking support from businesses who may be willing to sponsor our school to help buffer the cost of educational visits. This much-needed support would allow us to continue to offer regular trips which are vital to building confidence, widening perspectives and inspiring young minds.


