# CURRICULUM NEWS



This week, all of our children have started their new projects. Throughout the Spring Term, all children in years one to four will have a Geography project as their main focus - we call these Driver Projects. Alongside this, they will continue to explore the full breadth of the curriculum with links being made between the different subjects. Children in Reception will explore the full scope of the EYFS curriculum.

Today you should have received a knowledge organiser for your child's new Driver Project. The idea of the knowledge organiser is to communicate to you what your child will be learning and to enable you to talk around this at home with your child. For some, this may provide ideas of activities to do with your child or places to visit. Any discussion about these will help your child with their education.

If you have any questions about what your child is learning, how they are learning it and what you can do to further support them at home, please book a parent consultation with your child's class teacher when the booking system opens. We are hoping to open this to you early next week. Parent consultations will take place in person on Tuesday 16th January or virtually on Thursday 18th January.
