PARENT SUPPORT ADVISOR

The PSA provides support and access to services for families by helping parents develop confidence and a sense of empowerment when dealing with difficulties.

Hello, my name is Karen Bennett and I am Mum to a little girl who attends St Mary's and a little boy who will soon be 1. I have lived in Charminster for 18 years and am passionate about the local communities which I want to support through this role.

I am a trained youth worker and have worked with young people for over 15 years. I was a Participation Worker with Action for Children for just under 12 years, working with vulnerable children, young people and their parents. I worked creatively to help them have a voice in the services they used and ensured decision-makers listened to their views when shaping and funding services.

As the PSA in school I will have the children at the heart of everything I do, to ensure they realise and aspire to achieve their full potential. Through fostering positive relationships between families and staff, we can work together to help all children to enjoy and thrive at school.....

I am in school Monday to Thursday until early afternoon and I am contactable via email at all times.

The role of the PSA includes:

Being someone to talk to - a friendly face to listen and support - The PSA is a dedicated single point of contact who is always available as a listening ear to provide support for parents in addition to the teaching staff.

Providing moral support, help and advice in dealing with family difficulties - The PSA can help with difficulties they may be having such as relationship difficulties between parent and child.

Being an advocate and guide in getting the right support and services they need—The PSA can act as a link between the family, the school and the wider range of agencies who provide extended services for families. In some cases providing information will be enough in other cases the PSA can act as an advocate for the family in accessing external agency support.

Improving outcomes for children and families, enhancing family stability and well-being—The PSA can offer support, advice and guidance.

Supporting parents and children to feel more confident and empowered in dealing with situations—By supporting parents to feel more confident in their abilities they are empowered to deal with difficulties, allowing them to act more autonomously. Parents are the experts in their and their children's lives, the PSA will work alongside parents using this expertise to improve outcomes for their children.

Enabling smoother transitions - The PSA can provide valuable support for both parents and children at times of transition. Identifying vulnerable children at transition and providing the correct level of intervention can support children in making smoother transitions.



My aims are to:

Provide direct and confidential support for families within the school environment.

Offer support on a range of parenting issues.

Provide information about school matters.

Provide families with information regarding earning opportunities for both the parents and children.

Provide access to family programmes such as Strengthening Families, Getting Ready for School, Helping in School and the Family Jigsaw workshops.

Assist families at times of transition, entering school, changing classes and moving to middle school.

Act as a link between the family and external agencies.

Provide information to families for supporting children at home.

Support new families with transition into Reception.

Work with families to improve attendance and raise their child's educational achievements.

Offer support for families to attend school meetings and parent consultations.

Work alongside parents and carers to give them the strategies and tools to help themselves and their children.

Use Incredible Years Parenting concepts and strategies to support parents.
